<u>Chocolate Cake</u> (from the March 1933 *Relief Society Magazine*. I've added this in recognition of the 174<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Relief Society on 17 March!)

**Dark Batter:** 1 cup grated chocolate

1 egg ½ cup milk ½ cup brown sugar 1 tsp vanilla

Beat the egg slightly, add sugar, milk and chocolate. Cook over hot water until the mixture is thick and smooth, stir often. Let cool, then add vanilla. This mixture can be cooling while the cake batter is being made.

Cake batter:1 cup milk½ cup butter2 cups flour1 cup brown sugar½ tsp baking powder

2 eggs, separated, whites beaten till fluffy.

1 tsp bicarb soda, dissolved in 2 tablespoons boiling water.

Cream the butter well, then add the sugar. When blended, add egg yolks and beat. Mix flour and baking powder, and add alternately with the milk. Add the dark batter and mix. Then fold in fluffy egg whites and dissolved soda.

Pour into 2 tins and bake at 175C for about 40 minutes.

<u>Chocolate Cake</u> (from the March 1933 *Relief Society Magazine*. I've added this in recognition of the 174<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Relief Society on 17 March!)

**Dark Batter:** 1 cup grated chocolate

1 egg ½ cup milk ½ cup brown sugar 1 tsp vanilla

Beat the egg slightly, add sugar, milk and chocolate. Cook over hot water until the mixture is thick and smooth, stir often. Let cool, then add vanilla. This mixture can be cooling while the cake batter is being made.

Cake batter:1 cup milk½ cup butter2 cups flour

1 cup brown sugar ½ tsp baking powder

2 eggs, separated, whites beaten till fluffy.

1 tsp bicarb soda, dissolved in 2 tablespoons boiling water.

Cream the butter well, then add the sugar. When blended, add egg yolks and beat. Mix flour and baking powder, and add alternately with the milk. Add the dark batter and mix. Then fold in fluffy egg whites and dissolved soda.

Pour into 2 tins and bake at 175C for about 40 minutes.
